## PRESENTATION CONTENTS

All groups may present either Aparima, 'Ote'a or both styles of Tahitian dance including, but not limited to, Hivinau, Pa'oa, solo Ori Tahiti, Couples, Comedy, Drama or other forms of Tahitian Dance to Music. A traditional Drum Pehe section may be included. Ahuroa that is a separate category may not be included in Aparima/ 'Ote'a combined presentation.

### PERFORMANCE DATE

The Tamari'i, Beginner/Intermediate and Advanced on Sunday, March 22, 2020.

#### **CHECK IN**

## Tamari'i ,Beginner/Intermediate and Advanced

Instructors/Directors or designated assistant must check-in their group between 8:00 am - 9:00 am on Sunday of the performance. The group entry fee includes entry into competition for the minimum number of combined performers and musicians, and will also include one (1) adult chaperone pass per seven (7) dancers/musicians, which must be designated as such on above list. Discounted \$10 tickets will available for additional performers above the Minimum. At check-in, directors will receive a packet containing their group's allotment of entry passes. This is for the day of performance only. Group Roster must match Group Participants list included on the application. Family and friends of competitors must purchase their own tickets.

## **CATEGORIES**

## Tamari'i Group: Aparima Or 'Ote'a

Performers may be up to and including thirteen (13) years of age as of March 22, 2020. Drummers and musicians may be of any age. Pre-recorded music is permitted but may result in lower score.

## Beg/Int Amateur: Aparima or 'Ote'a

No age restrictions will be imposed. If the majority of the performers in the group perform at a student/community group level, then the group must register as an amateur. Groups may separate their presentation to aparima by itself or ote'a. Prerecorded music is permitted but MUST be of high quality or may result in a lower music score.

## Adv/Professional: Aparima or 'Ote'a

Performers must be at least twelve (12) years of age as of March 22, 2020. If the majority of the performers in the group perform on a continuous basis or on a professional level, then the group must register as professional. May not separate presentation, and must have live music.

# **Music Competition**

This is an optional category for Beg/Int and Advanced groups who use live music. Judging will occur during the Aparima and/or Ahuroa segment, and "The Use of Tahitian Language/ Pronunciation/ Accompaniment" scores from the Aparima and/or Ahuroa score sheets will be part of the judging. Acoustic instruments will be given preference over electric instruments

#### **GROUP SIZE CRITERIA**

# Tamari'i Group: Aparima or 'Ote'a

There must be a minimum of seven (7) performers and five (5) musicians. There is no maximum limit set, but additional dancers and musicians must purchase a ticket.

# Beg/Int Amateur: Aparima or 'Ote'a

There must be a minimum of seven (7) performers and five (5) musicians. There is no maximum limit set, but additional dancers and musicians must purchase a ticket.

## Adv/Professional: Aparima or 'Ote'a

There must be a minimum of fifteen (15) performers and seven (7) musicians. There is no maximum limit set, but additional dancers and musicians must purchase a ticket.

### **MULTIPLE ENTRIES**

A Group may enter Tamari'i as well as Amateur Group and Professional Group category in `Ote'a or Aparima, but may NOT use the same dancers in each Group Category.

If a group uses dancers in an Amateur Group Aparima/'Ote'a, these same dancers may not also represent the organization in Professional Group presentation or Tamari'i Group.

A group can enter the music competition with their Ahuroa as well as any Aparima, but they must pay for each entry.

#### **GROUP PRESENTATIONS**

The combined presentation must be performed in one-time period. In the event a combined Aparima/'Ote'a is performed and quick costume changes are needed by the dancers, a dressing space for quick costume changes will be located near the stage area.

## DRESSING ROOM DEPOSIT

A money order or cashier's check for \$100.00 <u>MUST</u> accompany the group entry application as a cleaning deposit for the dressing room area. The check will be deposited, and money held until after the inspection of group dressing rooms on Sunday. The condition of the facility will determine if the deposit is to be returned, if so, a check will be written.

# IN THE EVENT OF A TIE

In the event of groups tying for a place, the group with the highest combined "Esprit de Corps", "Costume" scores and most favorite Ra'atira will be determine the winner.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS - TAHITIAN DANCE GROUP COMPETITION

### 1. ENTRY FORM

To become a competing group, an entry form MUST be returned with the entry fee. Group entries are limited due to maximum occupancy of the building and will be first come, first serve.

### 2. FACT SHEET

Each group will provide multiple copies (minimum of eight (8)). Fact Sheets may be used for press releases as well as explanatory narrative to audience members. See separate page describing the desired contents of the Fact Sheet.

\*\*Due date for Fact Sheets is March 7, 2020.

### 3. TIME LIMITS

Timing starts with either the first note of music or with the first dancer to enter the stage. Timing ends with either the last note of music or with the last dancer to exit the stage.

### **Aparima**

Minimum of six (6) minutes to a maximum of ten (10) mins.

## Ote'a

Minimum of eight (8) minutes to a maximum of fifteen (15) mins.

## **Combined Presentations**

Minimum of fourteen (14) minutes to a maximum of twenty-five (25) mins.

### 4. COSTUMES

Costumes should be appropriate to the main style of dancing and theme presented. For example, ti leaves or more skirts for 'Ote'a, ti leaves, pareo for Aparima. No hot glue.

SILK OR PLASTIC FLOWERS ARE PROHIBITED.

For groups entering in the combined presentation, a costume change is necessary or the group will lose the second costume score.

Musicians must wear matching costumes deemed appropriate for Tahitian Music.

# 5. ENTRY FEES

An entry fee must accompany the application form.
